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CENTRAL AMERICA

San José, Costa Rica

Human Rights in the Americas

Academic program: May 22 – June 9 (4 units)

Optional internship: June 12 ~ July 21 (4-5 units)

Home of the Inter-American Court of Human Rights, San José offers an ideal location for the study of human rights. This three-week, four-unit academic program will introduce students to international human rights law, the inter-American human rights system, and explores current issues such as business law and human rights and transitional justice. Optional Spanish language instruction and a cultural immersion program will be offered at no additional charge.

Mix & Match • Students may be placed in an internship with an intergovernmental organization, governmental institution, or non-governmental organization in Costa Rica, Mexico, Guatemala, Puerto Rico, Peru, or the Dominican Republic. Spanish language skills may be required for some internships.

AUSTRALIA

Sydney, Australia

Human Rights: Forced Migration Law and International Environmental Law

Academic program: May 22 – June 9 (4 units)

Optional internship: June 12 ~ July 21 (4-5 units)

The program will focus on two issues of tremendous global importance – forced migration and international environmental law. The forced migration topics will include refugee law; relief for victims of trafficking in persons, torture, crime, and war; and environmental factors in migration flows. The international environmental law topics will include climate change law, the right to water, environmental justice, and indigenous law and land rights. There will be time for site visits to Australian courts and legal institutions and for a weekend trip to a wildlife park and the Blue Mountains.

Mix & Match • Students may be placed in an internship with a law firm in Fiji or a law office or a legal aid organization in Sydney or Melbourne.



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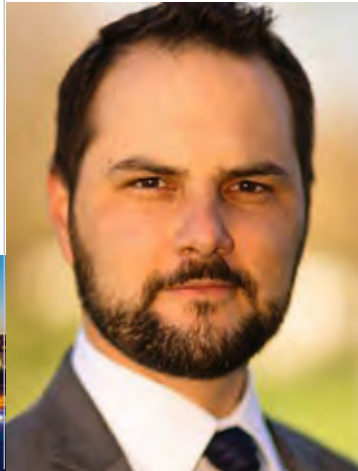

EUROPE

The Hague, Netherlands
International Criminal Justice

Academic program: May 29 – June 9 (3 units)

The two-week academic program in The Hague will include study visits to the International Criminal Court (ICC) and the International Criminal Tribunal for the Former Yugoslavia (ICTY) as well as other ongoing tribunals. Students will have the opportunity to observe actual trial proceedings, witnessing criminal justice, trial advocacy, and comparative and international law in action.

Mix & Match • Students may enroll in either the Geneva program or the Oxford academic program at the conclusion of the academic program in The Hague.

* Dates, locations and requirements may be subject to change. Students may earn up to the maximum units permitted by their law school. Santa Clara students may earn up to a maximum of eight units for the summer; other law schools may permit more or fewer units to be earned during the summer session. Vienna, Austria

Law and Business in the European Union

Academic program: May 22 – June 9 (4 units)

Optional internship: June 12 ~ July 14 (4 units)

The Vienna academic/internship program will provide students the opportunity to learn about European business and trade as well as various legal and political issues facing the European Union.

Mix & Match • Students may be placed in an internship in Vienna, Budapest, or Kuwait at the conclusion of the Vienna academic program. Alternatively, students may enroll in the Geneva program or the Oxford program at the conclusion of the Vienna academic program.

Oxford, England

Classic Oxford Tutorials

Academic program: June 28 – July 28 (5 units)

The Oxford academic program will offer an exceptional opportunity for individualized study. Students will have the opportunity to conduct an in-depth exploration of an area of law in the classic Oxford tutorial setting. Conceived at Oxford, the unique tutorial method will allow the student personal discussion time with his or her professor in a subject area chosen by the student.

Mix & Match • Students may enroll in all other academic programs, including The Hague, Geneva, Sydney, or Vienna prior to the Oxford academic program.

Munich, Germany

Comparative Intellectual Property Law

Academic program: May 29 – June 23 (5 units)

Optional internship: June 26 ~ July 21 (3 units)

The Munich academic/internship program will examine European patent, trademark, and copyright law well as international systems for intellectual property protection. Coursework will be designed both for individuals with no technical background or prior coursework in intellectual property, as well as for more advanced students.

Mix & Match • Students may be placed in an internship at the conclusion of the Munich academic program or concurrently with the Munich academic program. Internship placements require either German language skills or a technical background – but not both. Alternatively, students may enroll in the Geneva program or the Oxford program at the conclusion of the Vienna academic program.



ASIA

Shanghai, China

Doing Business in China

Academic program: May 22 – June 9 (4 units)

Optional internship: June 12 ~ July 21 (4-5 units)

The Shanghai academic/internship program will provide students with an excellent opportunity to become familiar with the commercial capital of the world’s fastest growing economy, and a unique perspective on the economic forces of the 21st century. This three-week, four-unit program will introduce students to the Chinese legal system, with a special focus on business and trade laws in China. The classes will be taught by local Chinese professors and practitioners.

Mix & Match • Students may be placed in internships with top law firms and corporations in Shanghai, Guangzhou, Beijing, Hong Kong, or Taipei. Mandarin Chinese language skills are highly desirable, except for internships in Hong Kong, where students may be placed with barrister chambers and the high court.

Tokyo, Japan

Doing Business in Japan & Japanese Patent and Copyright Law

Academic program: May 29 – June 20 (4-5 units)

Optional internship: June 26 ~ July 28 (4 units)

This program presents an opportunity to study law in a fascinating city that remains one of the world’s leading economic and financial centers. The core three-week, four-unit class will introduce students to the Japanese legal system and will explore current issues in international trade and business law. Students will have the opportunity to take an optional, additional one-unit class in Japanese patent and copyright law.

Mix & Match • Current law students may be placed in internships with top law firms and corporations in Tokyo or Seoul, South Korea.

Singapore

Doing Business in South East Asia and Human Rights

Academic program: May 22 – June 9 (4 units)

Optional internship: June 12 ~ July 21 (4-5 units)

The Singapore program will focus on the intersection of business and human rights in this thriving regional economic hub that has absorbed numerous cultures and religions. This three-week, four-unit academic program will introduce students to the challenges facing multinational corporations operating in this dynamic and vibrant region.

Mix & Match • Students may be placed in internships with top law firms, corporations or non-governmental organizations in Singapore, Cambodia, Vietnam, or India.
