Submit your accommodations request via your NCBE Account by the Recommended Submission Deadline

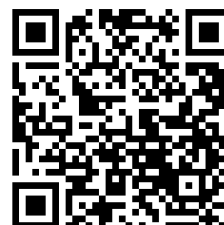
PLEASE NOTE

- Applicants must apply for accommodations and receive their determination **PRIOR** to registering and scheduling a test appointment
- Accommodations **cannot** be added to an existing test appointment
- It typically takes NCBE **25 business days to review** a request
- If submitting after the Recommended Submission Deadline, the decision may not be received in time to enable Pearson VUE to prepare for approved accommodations. In that event, you may test under standard conditions (without accommodations). You may also postpone testing until the next administration

UNIVERSITY RESOURCES

The U of M Counseling Center and Disability Resources for Students (DRS) provide resources to assist you requesting MPRE accommodations.



COUNSELING CENTER

For new or updated testing, contact the **University of Memphis Counseling Center** and specifically request an assessment for bar accommodations (not MPRE) to cover both the MPRE and Bar Exam requirements.

Please Note: The NCBE requires current documentation (e.g., within the past five years for Learning Disabilities and ADHD and within the past year for physical, chronic health-related, and psychological disabilities).

The process can take up to 8 weeks to complete. Students should initiate the evaluation process at least 10-12 weeks prior to the **Recommended Submission Deadline**.

Evaluations are in-person on main campus. Students should anticipate an out-of-pocket cost and the following process:

- Walk-In Screening (no appointment; approx. 30 min)
- Assessment Clinical Review (1 hour)
- 2-Hour Session x 2 (4 hours)
- Results Review (1 hour)

For **Learning Disabilities, Psychological (Mental Health) Disabilities** or **ADHD** evaluation and documentation, contact the Counseling Center.

For **Visual** or **Physical Disabilities**, see a qualified professional and provide the Medical Documentation Guidelines relevant to your disability.



DISABILITY RESOURCES FOR STUDENTS

If you currently receive Law School Testing Accommodations, the **University of Memphis Disabilities Resources for Students (DRS)** will assist you by completing the Certification of Accommodation History.

Please complete your portion of the form and submit to DRS at least two weeks prior to the Recommended Submission Deadline.
